

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

What a joy to be back again, directing another Summer School! I said last year that there was a pressure coming into Summer School as a new director, and now being brought back, there's a new pressure to show what I've learnt from my last experience and to prove I have more to offer.

Choosing a show for Summer School is not always an easy task. Being an educational experience designed to highlight the up-and-coming talent in greater Hobart, we want to make sure we are giving opportunities to as many performers as possible. We also want to make sure that the material we are presenting is appropriate for the cast and relevant to the world we are living in now. When I discovered that Summer School had never produced Grease, it seemed like an obvious choice.

Since its opening on Broadway and subsequent film release in the 70s, Grease has gained a massive following as a campy yet heartfelt representation of being a teenager in America. Being a product of its time though, it has, justifiably, also gained an ever-growing perception of being deeply rooted in misogyny and toxic masculinity. One of the biggest detractors people have around the show is the idea of Sandy changing who she is just for Danny.

For me, this is a story about personal change, driven by an individual's desire to both fit into society, but to also own who they are without fear of being ridiculed by their peers. Audiences are used to seeing Sandy change everything about herself for Danny, whereas I see Danny and Sandy learning from each other and their friends and finding a middle ground that brings out the best in them both.

Something that I wanted to bring to the forefront of this story was the relationships between our "T-Birds" and "Pink Ladies". A

thing that struck me when reading the script for the first time was how mean all the characters were written to be towards one another. These characters are, after all, best friends, and the idea of watching them just being mean and sarcastic to each other just isn't something that I think reflects friendships now. The cast and I spent a lot of time together working on ways to change the delivery of lines that were written to be mean or hurtful, turning them into the banter that only you and your closest friends could share. There are, of course, some moments where a character's comments towards another do strike a nerve, and it's these moments where we could fully explore how our peers impact the way we develop as people.

The journey of bringing this show to life has been so enlightening and rewarding. Reexamining a text will always be a collaborative process and having a cast and crew who were so eager to ask the important questions about how to give this story new life, and also willing to help me find the answers that I didn't have already, will always be something I treasure. A special thank you will always go out to Caitlin, Drew and Mark, who were with me from the very beginning of this process. You three have such an amazing skill for bringing out the best in people and this cast are lucky to have had you. Helen, Chris, Gareth, Andrew, Bianca P, Bianca L and Alex, thank you all for your tireless work to make every aspect of this show look and sound amazing! You all are really the best of the best.

And finally, thank YOU dear patron, for being the reason that we get to do what we love.

OUR STORY

It's 1959, and Rydell High School's senior class is in rare form. The too-cool-for-school "T-Birds" are stealing hub-caps and acting tough and their gum-snapping, hip-shaking "Pink Ladies" are looking hot in bobby sox and pedal pushers.

The 1950s high school dream is about to explode in this rollicking musical that is both an homage to the idealism of the fifties and a satire of high schoolers' age-old desire to be rebellious, provocative and rebellious. At the heart of the story is the romance between hotrodding gangster Danny Zuko and the sweet

new girl in town, Sandy Dumbrowski. They had a secret romance in summer, but now back in the context of school, peer-pressure and cliques make their love a bit more complicated. Can Danny maintain his cool dude status and still make demure Sandy his girl?

The whole gang sings and dances around Danny and Sandy's romance, through such hit songs as Greased Lightnin', We Go Together, You're The One That I Want, and Hopelessly Devoted to You - recalling the music of Buddy Holly, Little Richard and Elvis Presley that became the soundtrack of a generation.

OUR HISTORY

The high standard of theatre productions presented around Hobart by independent, state schools, and colleges had frequently been praised; leading to talk of how exciting it may be if a combined production was presented with students from as many institutions as possible. That finally happened with the production of Les Misérables School Edition in March, 2005.

It was so successful that the idea has continued over the years with productions of Back to the 80's in 2006, Jesus Christ Superstar in 2007, Oklahoma! in 2008, Pirates of Penzance in 2009, Guys and Dolls in 2010, Urinetown in 2011, The Producers in 2012, The Drowsy Chaperone in 2013, Jesus Christ Superstar in 2014, The Wedding Singer in 2015, The Addams Family in 2016, 9 to 5 in 2017, Annie Get Your Gun in 2018, Spring Awakening in 2019, Be More Chill in 2020, Heathers School Edition in 2021, and Guys and Dolls in 2022.

The aims of the Hobart Theatre Summer School are to:

- Complement the curricular drama and music experience for students
- Offer a unique opportunity to work with and learn from practitioners from the theatre industry
- Meet and work with peers from other schools and colleges across the diverse suburbs, educational facilities and backgrounds in the south of the state

It also enables hands-on experience of the reality of a major performing arts production – a "full season" in the theatre – somewhat different to the short runs most college or school productions entail.
